

Our very large contingent of Corfu travel agents and local politicians (and the one who did the work i.e. me) was waiting for our luggage as the clock hit the top of the hour. In an instant, everything came to a standstill. It was just like that kiddie party game 'Statues' when you have to dance around until the music stops and then hold your pose (actually, not exactly; most people immediately adopted a pious 'stand to attention' posture). The conveyer belt jerked to a halt, announcements ceased. My delegation, all Greeks apart from me, thought they'd entered the Twilight Zone, and it even took me a few seconds to realise what was going on. Before panic started and our party began to scatter in fear, I was able to whisper reassurances that it was not a time warp, but an organised 'event'. We had a laugh about it later.

Sp-amblings: First Family Meals - Oh dear!

THE VERY FIRST FOOD I PARTOOK OF at the in-law's house (not yet even prospective in-laws, then) should have served as a warning. I was passing one evening with a fellow rep and was invited in (future hubby wasn't there). Would we like a bite to eat? they asked. Reps never turn down a free nosh, so we took up the invitation with enthusiasm - especially when we were asked whether we liked squid. Didn't we just!

Having up until then only patronised tavernas, we awaited a nice plate of just-fried cephalopod, crisp on the outside and meltingly tender indoors (you don't always get that in tavernas, but one always lives in hope). What we got arrived in an old, stained and rather cracked plastic Tupperware-type box. The contents might have been squid if you could distinguish the molluscs from the congealed oil they were sitting in (straight from the fridge). Our smiles became somewhat fixed. Then, once we had prised one of the creatures out of its lard-like encasing, we discovered the full horror of our situation: The squids had not been gutted.



Squid intestines do you no harm, but they boast the unfortunately unappetising colour of a swollen sheeptick, and a rather spongy texture (if you have to think about it, instead of trying to force the bits down with a piece of bread to disguise their character). How we managed to consume a squid apiece I do not know, but we did, refusing a second helping on the basis that we were eating elsewhere later.

Fast forward to another family squid experience nothing revolting this time, just a huge disappointment. I was overwintering for the first time in the village, staying at a little cottage very close to the future in-laws, and eating at their place, as my kitchen was less than minimal. That morning I was advised that there was squid for lunch. Since lunch was cooked fresh every day, I knew the meal would not comprise congealed leftovers (see above), so I awaited the food with excited anticipation. Sitting down at table, I was gratified to see a massive serving platter, piled high and covered with foil, necessary to keep it warm (more of that in future Scramblings). Mentally, I rubbed my hands together with glee.

Then - ta da! - the foil was whipped off: To reveal a massive mountain of potatoes, with a single squid, like a triumphant lone hiker, sitting on the peak. My share was half the tentacle cluster. The potatoes were tasty, though.

Squid was a special treat simply because I was in the company of a family that was only just moving on from a self-sufficient lifestyle, just on the cusp of entering (more) modern times. Electricity had only reached the village some twenty years previously, and refrigeration was a comparatively new phenomenon (few housewives knew yet how to use one hygienically). In those past days before fridges, meat appeared on the table infrequently, not because of any shortage of animals, but because if you kill a beast and you don't have any refrigeration you have to eat it all, at once.

Pigs, which lend themselves to various preservation methods, did not much play a role in animal husbandry in that close-to-town locality, and in consequence noone possessed the knowledge that their counterparts in say - Italy have of preparing pork products like sausages and salami. (Strangely, or maybe not, women in outlying villages that were sucked into 'civilisation' later were much more practised in charcuterie than ones closer to the urban area.)

So, if you had a lamb for slaughter, you waited for a special day and shared it with extended family. If you had an ox, you sold it to a butcher in town and spent the money on items you could store to eat later.

This scenario accounts for the otherwise inexplicable popularity of... SPAM (or SWAN as it is called in Greece) *. Tinned Spam was about the first preserved meat product to be shipped in after the War, probably as part of the aid programme. It was therefore the first animal protein the Greeks got to eat after the starvation they had endured under the Germans (who confiscated the locals' food to feed their troops). A certain generation regards eating it almost as a religious experience. Plus, shop-bought meat protein was 'prestigious' as it showed you had money to pay for it. Not everyone had spare cash in those days, so if you had some you flaunted it.



Thus the villagers' cuisine in the early and mid-1980s (at least in my settlement) was based on food you COULD store: whether vegetables that could be re-cropped and re-harvested throughout the summer like courgettes, aubergines and such, or those that could sit untouched in the winter fields, like cabbages; to ones that could be dried, such as corn, tomatoes and pulses of various sorts; to storable tubers like potatoes and sweet potatoes.

So, in those very early days I was probably experiencing a cuisine that was in essence hundreds - or even thousands - of years old. Though some of the food was undoubtably disgusting, I feel privileged.

* Battered Spam, deep fried in lard, was one of the regular offerings for supper at my boarding school (see early 'Scramblings'). The fact that this was one of the more enjoyable supper dishes tells you all you have to know about the food that was forced on us.

Simon's World

I will tell you about a man I never met, whose art is, at best, elusive. Aristeidis Metallinos -Αριστείδης Μεταλληνός was a Greek sculptor, unknown to any art school, though the woman's shoe he carved from local stone when he was 20, might have gained him entry to one. He was born in 1908, one of three sons of Zacharias and Eleni Metallinos of Ano Korakiana, where he earned his living as a shoemaker, stonemason, builder and carpenter. When he was sixty-seven, Metallinos started to fulfil his long-held purpose of becoming a sculptor. "I am not without faults, but I mean to use my hammer and chisel to bear witness to human nature and its weaknesses" «να παρουσιάσω τον άνθρωπο και τα ελαττώματά του».



Andrea, the artist's son, whose funeral in Ag Athanasios in 2016, we were honoured to attend with most of Ano Korakiana, had fixed to his father's house, on Democracy Street in the village centre, a carving, by his dad, of a Skops owl, holding a builder's trowel and sculptor's hammer with the date 1973, marking the year Aristeidis Metallinos became an artist. The self-taught sculptor's accumulated work depicts, in local stone and Kozani marble (the finest, from a land that is a parent of marble), a unique record of a pastoral economy whose vestiges remain mainly for the curiosity of urban visitors; works, sometimes on friezes, that emphasise the primacy of the family and labour of artisans - tilling the earth, wine making, olive pressing, horse shoeing, dancing, goat milking, wool spinning, forestry in the woods, driving a cart to market with the family, the arrival of the tinker in the village with a blast on his trumpet, yet mingling with these cherished folk themes, works that are erotic, ribald, subversive and, to some in his village, embarrassing, lewd and, so swiftly after the fall of the Junta, indiscreet in their hostility to the powerful.



If you liked Mary Stewart, you'll doubtless love this book

Mary Stewart's books, the best of them written in the 50s and 60s, diverged from the 'romantic fiction' genre of the time by combining romance with exotic locations (the south of France, Greece, the Alps, the Isle of Skye, Northumberland etc), 'thriller' plots, and usually a touch of Gothic demi-horror. Effrosyni Moschoudi writes in a similar mould, but her novels additionally contain an element of the supernatural. So... if you like Mary Stewart, and if you enjoy suspending belief, you'll LOVE 'The Raven Witch of Corfu', now available on Amazon.



And did you know that one of Mary Stewart's top novels was set on Corfu? Back in 1965, she wrote a thriller that appealed to everyone who had ever visited the island: 'This Rough Magic'. The Castello, then a hotel, was the inspiration for the large villa that formed the centre of the action, but it was transported to a different location nearer the sea. 'An animated adventure story in which suspense and romance are expertly intermingled,' said the Observer critic at the time, and quite rightly too. The plot, interwoven with strands from Shakespeare's Tempest, and with hints of ancient superstitions, has stood the test of time.

Part of the allure of novels set in Corfu, for those of us who live here or visit on holiday, comes from trying to identify the actual houses and real people that have discreetly inspired the authors. The setting for 'The Raven Witch' is a very recognisable Messongi, but on whom the author based the characters is anyone's guess (some of the nastier ones may be Effrosyni's pen-mightier-than-sword revenge on unpleasant neighbours). But transposing the location of buildings, as Mary Stewart did with the Castello, or changing their use (Stewart was guilty again) can give rise to bewilderment. Another such author was Elizabeth Harris; in her book 'The Sun-Worshippers', (publ. early nineties), she converted both the Reading Society building and the Achillion into private houses. Moreover, Ms. Harris's Corfu appears to be largely populated by gods and satyrs - surely nothing to do with the Corfu we know and love?

In the seventies, Dennis Wheatley made Corfu the setting for one of his thrillers, 'Dangerous Inheritance', while D. Faralla wrote 'Children of Lucifer'. Since Corfu - perhaps unsurprisingly - has always been a popular setting for novels of magic, fantasy and the supernatural, Effrosyni Moschoudi, in 'The Raven Witch of Corfu', is following a venerable fantastic tradition.



Exclusive: The Second **Corfu Garbage Festival** - Better than Ever!

Yet again, ineffective measures by local authorities to promote in other publications their vast programme of cultural events have enabled The Agiot - through its team of dedicated journalists - to bring you yet another exclusive report about this major Waste-Based Happening (which is taking place in the framework of the EU Culture V Programme Reg. DG67932/2006; Regional Funding packages available on application). Corfu's second biennial Festival of Garbage is a massive success, the organisers have declared. The island-wide celebration of trash, instituted by the Municipality of Corfu, has been running all summer,

with fierce local competition between rival neighbourhoods to produce the best display. Final judging of the exhibits will take place throughout November, with the winner to be announced in time for Christmas.

'We have been blown away by the standard of this year's competition,' declared the Municipality's coordinator Polly Skoupidi. 'Locals have been really supportive in constructing the displays of garbage, which are noticeably bigger and better than the ones exhibited in the inaugural Festival two years ago. Such has been the enthusiasm of our citizens in adding to the mountains of trash that we are considering making the Festival an annual event; indeed, there have been calls for the garbage displays to become a permanent feature of our roadsides throughout the entire year. And that of course would at a stroke solve the Municipality's on -going difficulty in disposing of its waste! It's a winwin situation for everybody!'

Ms Skoupidi affirms that awareness of the Festival amongst the island's summer visitors has been running at a high level. 'We at the Municipality are proud that our tourists, upon their arrival, quickly become acquainted with this special, ongoing event, a phenomenon not generally noted with our local, non-touristic festivals. Our visitors mostly show their appreciation by pointing at the best trash displays whilst holding their noses. Increasingly, we notice that many are actually contributing to the displays by adding their own trash, and we deeply value that support. There have even been mentions of the event in the foreign press, which clearly demonstrates that this year's Festival is becoming established as a big international success.'

Readers may recall that prizes are given to garbage displays in the following categories:

Largest Garbage Display; Most Colourful Garbage Display (Colour: Diverse. Colour: Coordinated); Most Original Garbage Sculpture Display; Most Pungent Garbage Display; And for animal lovers: Your Cat's Favourite Heap.

There will also be an independent one-off prize for the 'Garbage Display which most represents European Union Values', an award which, in the shadow of Brexit, is designed to showcase a common European identity. This award is being sponsored personally by Jean-Claude Juncker. Theresa May was quick to slam the European Commission President's participation. 'This is just another example of the EU interfering in the internal workings of a sovereign state,' said the British Prime Minister. 'Mr Drun ... er ... Juncker ought to be ashamed of himself.' Contacted by this newspaper, an agent for the independent pressure group NGO European Waste Watch (EUWW), Apollo Pantika, warned, 'Mark my words. The EU will exploit this event as a pretext to take over the whole of Greece.'

Festival rules state that fly-tips are excluded from the competition and only official wheelie-bin venues may take part. The Committee underlines that checks will be made prior to the final decision by judges, aimed at ensuring that every display of waste has been initiated on and around a wheelie bin, even if the bins have subsequently been covered by a concealing mountain of donations. 'People can't just dump refuse wherever they want, you know,' remonstrated one of the judges.

Following the inaugural event in 2016, a dedicated team, entitled 'A Rubbish Society', was formed, with the aim of working towards the advancement of this and similar progressive developments. 'ARS', as it is affectionately referred to locally, has been monitoring garbage-heap construction efforts throughout the summer. 'We've been checking on the progress of the most popular trash mountains,' briefed ARS secretary Deedee Chucket, a prominent member of the local ex-pat community. 'The consensus of opinion is that the display outside the WaterFun Park is a leading contender for the top prize across the board, even though the initial promising construction was accidentally removed on one occasion during the summer. The JCB driver who perpetrated the action has since apologised, and Corfiots from all the surrounding villages have been guick to contribute to the replacement exhibit, which so far has surpassed all expectations.'

The management team at WaterFun is said to be 'thrilled' at the response. Said spokesperson Haris

There is a company in England called Inciner8 that has won the Queen's Award for Enterprise twice and which can supply the equipment to convert all of Corfu's 67,000 tons of annual waste into electricity/ domestic heating plus a reside suitable for making high quality concrete and concrete products/ road surfacing etc. Their products have been installed in 140 countries.

The current Inciner8 proposal would provide a WtE facility at the existing landfill site at Temploni to process waste during the summer and to deal with the existing landfill as well during the winter.

In addition, similar equipment would be provided at the illegal Lefkimmi landfill site to convert the waste there into free electricity and hot water for the community as an apology for previous grievances, leaving the site clear for alternative uses.

One plant is suggested for the north of the island, to avoid long distance haulage of waste, currently costing an estimated €70 in diesel fuel alone for each load in some cases, and a smaller plant would serve the needs of the neighboring island of Paxos. Sampounis, 'We anticipate that an award in this unique competition for the verge outside our famous waterpark will attract additional visitors for next summer season.

This Festival certainly has led to a distinct hike in tourism revenues, island-wide. Long may it continue!'

Readers should be reminded of the Festival's inspirational slogan, designed to boost foreign participation: 'Remember: We're All In This Together!'

There would be a need for one further processing facility near the centre of the island to make up the shortfall, which would also generate electricity to be sold to the national grid.

The Inciner8 equipment is normally set up in a closed building or self-contained shipping containers so there is no stockpiling of waste, no smell, and thanks to the secondary burn chamber technology, "the only thing emitting from the stack is a clean, odourless vapour." The system is compliant with the Industrial Emissions Directive (IED) limits and regulations and exceeds the requirements of all other relevant European legislation.

The entire project also conforms to the recommendations of the EU Report commission's Committee on Petitions findings, Directive 2008/98/ EC and the Regional Plan. Greece currently recovers energy from only 0.3% of its waste while the Inciner8 proposal would make Corfu a world leader in waste-to -energy recycling.

The ORC (electricity generating) equipment is manufactured by Trigon who are well known throughout Europe for the efficiency and durability of their products and is supplied and installed as a joint venture by Inciner8's sister company, Environ, the UK's market leader in renewable energy technology.

Recyclable materials can be diverted from the waste stream at any point before delivery when facilities become available to process them, but the main problem ~ that of disposal ~ can be addressed immediately while meeting all legislative environmental pollution requirements.

Ferrous and non-ferrous metals can be easily separated after incineration.

Infrastructure contracts including crane and plant hire, site preparation and civil works, concreting,

electrical and water mains laying, steel fabrication, waste shredding and building construction would be fulfilled by local contractors, and permanent jobs will be created for operating and maintenance staff.

The cost of the entire project for Corfu's population of 100,000 would work out at less than 70 cents per person per day for one year, after which they would benefit from the electricity production indefinitely. In any case it would seem that adequate funds have already been earmarked. http://enimerosi.com/ details_en.php?id=24265

Executive summary

Corfu produces almost 65,000 tonnes of solid municipal waste every year. it is proposed that waste -to-energy equipment is brought in capable of processing all of the annual waste and generating heat and/or electricity. The plan proposes the installation of 10 incinerators, each capable of processing up to 20 tonnes of waste per day, to be supplied and installed by the manufacturer, Inciner8 Ltd, a company with experience of similar installations in more than 180 countries around the world, and to be operated by staff employed by the Municipality of Corfu. Background

There are two landfill sites on the island. One is full, the other has licensing problems and there is no space on the island to create a new one.

Since it is also not permitted to remove solid waste by sea except in an emergency situation, no other practical long term solution has been proposed.

The use of this technology is fully consistent with the Regional Plan, the Strategic Plan and all present and proposed European legislation regarding emissions.

By getting rid of the accumulated backlog of domestic waste the separation of recyclable materials from the waste stream will be greatly facilitated.

As the percentage of waste being recycled increases, fewer units will be required on Corfu and surplus equipment can be sold or leased to other parts of Greece experiencing similar problems.

To save time, it is proposed that the initial order be for incineration units only, ready for the retro-fitting of a suitable energy conversion system including hot water, steam and electricity at a later date. A further proposal to amend the order can follow after due consideration of the most appropriate energy conversion system.

While the manufacturer will provide staff training and product maintenance, the facility will be owned and operated by the Municipality on behalf of the people of Corfu.

Objectives

The goal of the proposal is to safeguard the health and prosperity of the population through the hygienic disposal of all and any waste contamination of the environment. This would include the gradual consumption of existing waste in the landfills during the winter when the plant is not working at full capacity.

When the landfill sites are sufficiently restored the daily fines being imposed should be lifted and the funds can be used to cover operational costs.

While the equipment will initially be installed at the landfill sites, units may be relocated to other sites where the best use can be made of the heat produced, such as hot water for domestic heating or to power industrial processes.

Monitoring

In addition to the legal requirements to regularly monitor the performance of the equipment, there will be daily records of the quantity of waste consumed. At landfill sites where there are weighbridge facilities tonnage can be directly measured on delivery, while at other locations tonnage can be accurately calculated per hour of operation by comparison with the combustion times at landfills.

Both ferrous and non ferrous metals are easily recovered from the bottom ash of the incinerators and the tonnage of these reclaimed metals will also be closely monitored.

All the data will be included in the February report published annual by the municipality.

Licensing

Since the equipment is transportable there should be no planning issues and existing licenses should cover this variation in waste management methods at selected locations owned by the municipality. The hierarchy set by EU Directive 2008/98/EC favours energy recovery over landfill.

History

From 1985 to 2000 it was government policy to approve landfill over incineration for waste disposal, but even in the early 90s there was a government funded waste-toenergy incinerator installed on Zakinthos. Athens has also recently built a large new incinerator for hospital waste. The present government has no stated policy regarding incineration and there has never been any legislation to make it illegal.

The Fire Service does not permit the use of garden incinerators in the summer because of the potential fire risk, but they are widely used to burn garden and domestic waste in the winter, as are uncontained bonfires.

The installation on Zakinthos only operated for a few months as the equipment was very basic, the operators inexperienced and the waste was wet. In recent years the technology has improved greatly while the government policy was based on the technology of the time, which now includes a catalytic converter as well as the second chamber that burns off all the smoke and soot and fumes.

In recent years thermal treatment has become one of the fastest-growing sectors in waste management and accounts for up to half of all waste disposal strategies in Europe. This would be the first large scale project in Greece and could be a model for dealing with the 1000 illegal landfill sites across the whole country, much of which comprises islands and small rural communities.

Issues

A website set up to promote this scheme gained 1500 members in ten weeks and the draft proposal has been read more than 1500 times in Greek and English by people in over 50 countries. There has not been a single objection.

Some environmentalists were concerned that people might recycle less but statistics show that countries with more incineration also recycle more waste. Greece is the only country in Europe without incineration plants for municipal waste.

Other proposals

Currently the only other proposals are for short term or partial solutions. These include increased recycling, pyrolysis, export, a waste treatment plant and extending the landfill.

Extending the landfill at Lefkimmi, while unpopular, would postpone the crisis for about three and a half years until the new area is also full. The proposal to export up to 10,000 tonnes of waste to the new waste treatment facility on the mainland would also help, but if 20 tonnes of waste was carried on every single passenger ferry out of the port at Lefkimmi , then it would take about ten weeks to transport the 10,000 tonnes, while Corfu produces about a thousand tonnes of waste per week.

Recycling is an admirable long term goal, but as yet no country has managed to recycle much more than half of its waste, requiring incineration or landfill for the remainder.

Pyrolysis, as proposed by a number of groups and individuals, is an excellent way of turning waste oil, plastic and rubber into liquid fuel. However, those materials would first have to be separated from the general waste and the remaining 92% of the waste would require incineration or landfill.

Similarly waste treatment facilities only reduce the total amount of waste by around 15%, again requiring landfill or incineration for the remaining 85%.

Incineration leaves a residue of just 3%. This material is valuable and ideal for making concrete products, road surfacing etc. Zero landfill is therefore potentially achievable.

Costs

Large Waste-to-Energy plants cost hundreds of millions of euros and are only suitable for large cities like Athens. The typical cost of a small, static, 40,000 ton per annum static system is currently more than \$40 million.

The inciner8 proposal will provide 50% greater capacity for around half the price.

Running costs can be greatly reduced by using recycled oil as the ignition fuel and by grouping several machines together to avoid the cost of providing operational staff for each unit.

Sweden charges \$43 per tonne for incineration and income can be generated for Corfu by charging a reasonable fee to process commercial waste.

Detailed costs follow in the Inciner8 proposal, below.

Timescale

While static municipal incinerators can take years to build, Inciner8 are offering to provide the first unit in just 6 - 8 weeks and then every 4 - 5 weeks per unit for the remainder .

If the full price is paid then the contract can be completed in just 24 weeks from the signing of the contract and there will no longer be any need for landfill.

Re-cycling

In the last few days Liapades Recycling Centre has transported over 70,000 litres of recycling to Thessoliniki. Some of our recycling in Liapades is going further afield. Cardboard collected in Liapades is currently on its way to Vietnam. Plastic sheeting is on its way to Abu Dhabi.

Our recycling centre operates solely on the basis of voluntary effort. We have a small pool of volunteers from Liapades, Giannades, and Kokkini. If you would be interested in joining our team for two hours per week please get in touch (either by private message or a visit to the centre). If there are any businesses willing to sponsor our recycling activity with the supply of large heavy-duty bags/sacks, please get in touch.


Sure enough, really torrential stuff hits our neck of the woods on the 30th; driving home one night several cars had been engine-flooded in the vicinity of the airport.







VEGETABLE CRUMBLE INGREDIENTS: -

225 g pumpkin, peeled and chopped. 175g cauliflower florets 1 red pepper, diced. 50g frozen peas 1 medium-sized leek, chopped. 50g butter. 50g flour. 500ml milk. 2tsp creamed horseradish. Salt and pepper TOPPING: -50g butter. 50g porridge oats. 50g. grated Edam cheese. 50g breadcrumbs. 2 Tbsp sunflower seeds.

GO: -

Pre-heat oven to 180C

Steam vegetables until tender. Place in ovenproof dish.

Melt butter, stir in flour and cook for 2 minutes. Add milk, stirring well. Remove from heat, add horseradish and season.

Bring to the boil, pour sauce over vegetables and mix well.

Rub butter into oats and breadcrumbs. Stir in sunflower seeds and cheese, sprinkle over vegetables. Bake until browned. [about 35-40 minutes].


