



#### How to dream up new taxes

#### **Tracking Spring through Saturday Walks**

MARCH 1 (FRIDAY):
There's only one way out
of my gate and through
the fields, and only after
ten minutes does the
route diverge. Thus, on
shorter walks, we tend to
pass the same landmarks
time after time. One is a
solitary tree beside a
gravel track. On this
Friday morning, it was



winter-stark and bare; but on our early evening stroll later the same day, it suddenly was bearing the first greenery of the year - and so were similar ones alongside the road.

MARCH 2 (SATURDAY): A lovely day to walk to the exbeach of Myrtiotissa, where waves now crash on the place where 'lion-gold sand' once stretched. But just below the monastery, Bermuda Buttercup had taken over a steep bank, sea-facing and frost-free. This introduced flower is a pest, as it both seeds and suckers, muscling out the indigenous plants. But insects love it, and the area was a-flutter with at least a dozen species of butterflies, plus some hummingbird hawk-moths, all encouraged into activity by the glorious weather.



Other wild flowers of spring bloomed whilst we were walking. Driving post-walk on the back road to Tristrato, the tree canopies displayed a fuzz of golden-green in various shades, with lemony, amber or russet undertones, and fields were sheeted with pale alyssum. Hedgerows had suddenly sprouted a froth of white blossom, so that if you took wing over the valley - or more prosaically sent up a drone - you would see all the field patterns laid out in snowy borders.

MARCH 9 - MARCH 23. The middle weeks in March generally constitute the best time in all the year for wild flowers. It's a period when the floral palette of spring is at its most varied, before it's swallowed later in straggly purple vetch and thistle. But at the same time, the blooms of late winter remain: the beautiful Algerian iris, of which the Corfu version is a local sub-species; the lovely anemones, with their vast colour-chart ranging from glowing purple to bleached-out mauve, as well as its sky-blue mountain-loving cousin (Anemone blanda). Both anemones were the dominant species on our March 23 walk (Sokraki), the former carpeting forest glades and the yard of an isolated church; the paler blanda variety buried beneath protecting plants. I wish these weeks would last longer, but they are over in a blink.



# Sc-ramblings: Recipes from Koula's Kitchen Enjoy!

KOULA WAS MY EX SISTER-IN-LAW, a person of such quintessential stupidity that she'd have been a hot favourite in any competition to find the world's dimmest human. She was also incredibly bossy and congenitally unable to accept any other person's view as valid. On any matter. Give such an individual free rein in the kitchen at your peril...

Although she'd had normal schooling, Koula read with difficulty (with a finger running under the words and out loud), so written recipes were not part of her life. She had learned certain cookery techniques by watching her mother (basic stuff only, mostly boiled) and other women. But Koula knew better. If a dish was good when

made with one cup of olive oil, it would be better if you threw in two. If a dish worked when cooked for one hour, two hours cooking would perfect it. One Sunday morning, she bustled along to my house (too close for comfort, but then her residence on the moon would have been), carrying an oven tray covered with the ubiquitous foil and several towels (to ensure the neighbours did not find out what she was cooking so they couldn't gossip about it), her pull-out, plug-in oven having given up the ghost. I was instructed to cook it for her.

I did what the neighbours would have killed to have done - I peeked. This Sunday's lunch was pork, the menu under Koula having diverged from the alternating roast chicken and Pastitsada that Ma-in-law had served up before she lost culinary charge. Koula was a Moderniser (see December Agiot).

So, sitting in the oven tray was a hacked-off slab of pork. It was surrounded by potatoes and swam in about an inch of olive oil. So far so heavy-handed. But on top of the lot sat the contents of a whole packet of margarine (the much-hyped Neo Vitam). Such was my horror that I scooped up the marge and hurled it over the fence into next door's olive grove. When I later asked Koula why she'd added the marge to what is already a fatty meat (plus more fat from the olive oil), she replied: 'To give it some taste!' Considering the amount of salt, pepper and oregano that had been sprinkled on the meat, lack of taste was the least worry! By the way, I didn't let on that I'd chucked the marge - that would have invited instant death.

Lunch on New Year's Day was never an occasion to embrace with any enthusiasm. Family superstition dictated that absolutely every kind of food imaginable be served, on the basis that a generous nosh on the first day of the year would ensure bounty for the coming months. So, there was salami and spam and meatballs and chicken and beef stew and chops and potatoes and rice and pasta and salads and peas and olives and three sorts of cheese. And the cooked stuff was all overdone and cold to the point of congealing. Koula was the only 'cook' I have met who could prepare peas so that they were both over-boiled and bullet hard; she was the only person I knew who could grate carrots so that they possessed the texture of tree-bark.

My Pa-in-law, whose 40-year Valium habit caused mood-swings you needed to avoid, would consume anything put in front of him. I felt complemented initially when he tucked into my offerings with gusto and praise - until I saw him doing the same over a bowl of Boiled Bone Soup (see December). But even he complained at Koula's Pastitsada one Sunday - she had obviously taken inspiration from the 'Rope Stew' popular in tavernas a decade before (see various Scramblings from last year). Having no teeth, he could not even 'gum' the meat down as normal. Like in the event of any smidgen of censure, Koula bridled. 'Well, I don't know why it's tough. The animal was only slaughtered yesterday!' Many village women in those days were ignorant of the practice of hanging beef after killing (because you can only do this if you can refrigerate the meat), and would demand 'fresh' flesh. But since fridges were already a kitchen fixture of many years' usage, Koula's only excuse was ignorance and inability to take advice.

There are very few foods I cannot eat even if properly prepared (i.e. not by Koula). One is stockfish (onomatopoeically named 'stakofisi' in Greek). The recipe goes like this: Soak stockfish (cod dried to resemble a plank) in water for a week. Boil for seven hours.

Serve your guests with what now has the colour, taste and texture of corrugated cardboard - although the peppery sauce, heavy with garlic and lemon juice, was nice squidged into the potatoes - as long as you avoided the fishy chews.

The family was hosting a lunch for cousins from Athens, on their summer stay. We'd all finished eating the savoury part of the meal, 'starters' and main courses all going to table at once, as is normal village serving practice. Only Koula still had her nose in her plate in her true troughing style (and I mean this literally; just a one-inch gap between honker and pottery surface, in order to facilitate the shovelling). Then suddenly - horror! - her plate was empty; she came up for air, beady eyes scanning the table in case there was something still left. Her attention alighted on the tzatziki plate, where a scraping remained. Out went the prehensile finger and scooped up the leavings. Into mouth went finger. Finger returned to swab plate and back to mouth for final suck. No food left now! Koula leapt up. It was time for another course! Creamy shop-bought cake gifted by the guests! Koula picked up the knife to cut the confection, but before she made the first incision she carefully ran her finger down the blade, both ways. The unwashed finger flavoured with garlicky tzatziki, and dressed with her saliva...

That just takes the cake, doesn't it?

You don't say!



## Tickle Ties the knot

In the continuing series of useful knots and how to tie them, a more decorative knot that had useful origins

## The Monkey's Fist

The origin of the Monkey's Fist knot is as a heaving line knot used on ships of sail of yesteryear. However, the knot is now more popular as a decorative knot and can be found in sizes small to large: from key chains to door stopper weights.



- Take your rope and with the long working end make three wraps around the fingers of your hand.
- While holding the first set of turns in place, make three more turns passing outside the middle of the first three turns. Finish this step by passing the working end around one side of the first set of turns. This sets up the working end for the next step which passes the end through the inside of the previous wraps.
- Now make three turns around the set of wraps made in the previous step, passing through the inside of the knot.

  Double check that you have made the same number of turns for each step.
- Finishing the knot: At this point a round object can be inserted in the center of the wraps or the standing end of the rope can be tucked inside either with or without a stopper knot at the end as well. Working slowly (and patiently) begin tightening by working on each wrap, starting near the buried stopper knot and finishing with the other end of the rope. Do not pull too hard on the first few wraps. You will need to work your way through the knot more than once. The use of a small screwdriver or awl can help on the last tightening session through the knot.



Shouldn't one have to pass a urine test to get a benefits cheque because I have to pass one to earn it for them?


Please understand that I have no problem with helping people get back on their feet.





Heat the oil in a large pan, add the onions and fry until softened. Add the spices and garlic and cook for a further minute. Add the mixed vegetables and fry for five or six minutes, stirring. Add the stock, salt and pepper to taste, chilli powder, lemon juice, sugar and coconut milk.

Cover and simmer for about 20/25 minutes. Break the cauliflower into florets and cook for a further 15 minutes. Stir in the nuts and single cream and heat through gently. Serve with Basmati rice.





## This is Rubbish

### Stern warning from European Commission regarding the rubbish in Corfu



ATHENS. Greece once again on the receiving end of a warning - two months to give satisfactory explanations. The European Commission has sent a letter to the Greek authorities with a stern warning regarding waste management in Corfu. According to the report in *Kathimerini*, this follows complaints (since summer 2018) that waste is no longer being collected or treated on the island, and that it is being left on the streets or "sent to undisclosed locations".

In 2008 member states agreed to protect public health and the environment from waste through the implementation of suitable waste management and processing measures.

The EC says, "The EU guideline encourages the reduction in use of landfills and an increase in recycling and the re-use of waste. The fact that measures have not been implemented to deal with the waste situation in Corfu is a clear violation of EU environmental laws".

The warning from the Commission has been interpreted as the first step in preliminary proceedings before being referred to the European Court. The second step is a reasoned opinion - which is sent if the country doesn't give satisfactory explanations within two months.

# Town Council: There is no Plan B for the waste



COUNCIL MEETING - DIMOTIKO

CORFU. Kostas Nikolouzos said, "The matter of the operation of Lefkimmi residue landfill isn't my responsibility. The government is determined to speed up all the necessary procedures."

Last night's meeting of the Town Council was devoted almost exclusively to the issue of waste management and Corfu Mayor Kostas Nikolouzos explained the road map that had been announced on 13 March.

All interested parties were present at the meeting: both Temploni Societies and Lefkimmi Cultural Society as well as candidates in the upcoming local and regional elections.

After requesting that the discussion be carried out in a peaceful and civilised manner, the Mayor updated the Council and others present on the waste management plan and the latest developments. He stressed that if everything goes according to plan, we will be able to manage the waste this summer without any problems. If there are problems, there is no other management plan. The study for the construction of a Waste Management Unit in Temploni is complete - it was submitted on 31 December 2018 and is awaiting final approval. Meanwhile the procedure for commissioning a study for the residue landfill is in progress. Both of these projects will be included in the ESPA (National Strategic Reference Framework) programme with funding of approximately 50m Euros.

he implementation of the four projects - sorting at source, biowaste and recycling and the setting up of green spots - has also been speeded up. These are included in the ESPA programme with a budget of 2.9m Euros.

As regards the waste management transitional phase, the work has been contracted out and will be operational again from 1 April reinforced by a double baling belt. This will be followed by the repair and operation of the South Corfu residual landfill in Lefkimmi.

Once the 5-stremma plot of land owned by the Brotherhood charity has been granted permission in the immediate future, the transportation of residue bales from Temploni will commence.

Furthermore, once the purchase of the adjacent 52 stremma plot of land in Temploni has been completed and the necessary permission granted, the necessary construction work will begin in April for the temporary storage of residue bales along with restoration of the Temploni landfill - with a budget of 3.7m Euros.

Regarding Lefkimmi residual landfill, the Mayor said, "The matter of the operation of Lefkimmi residue landfill isn't my responsibility. I have made many efforts at great personal cost. If the government is determined that Lefkimmi should operate, let them find a way to do it."

#### Letter from TUI

In response to a question from the 'Kerkyraion Dimos' councillor Nikos Hirdaris regarding the letter from TUI, Kostas Nikolouzos said that he intends to give the same reply that he gave to the Ministry of Tourism, "If all goes well, we won't have a problem in the summer. If something doesn't go as planned, then I don't have an answer."

#### The fines

In response to a question from councillor Yiannis Kritikos regarding the financial correction of 4.7m Euros, Kostas Nikolouzos said that according to the latest update, if Lefkimmi landfill wasn't operational on 1 March 2019 the EU would charge the amount. The government informed the EU of the recent damage to the facility but nothing has been heard back. Regarding the fine for Temploni landfill, Mr. Nikolouzos said that another fine was expected - even bigger than that of 2012!

#### Proposal from Lefkimmi Cultural Society

At the meeting time was given for the representatives from Lefkimmi and Temploni to speak. For the first time, Lefkimmi Secretary Yiannis Pandis offered an alternative proposal for an incinerating system and said that they had made exploratory approaches to foreign companies asking for offers. Temploni President Magda Papanikolopoulou said there had been long-term mismanagement and opposed the plan to bury thousands of tons of waste as part of the renovation and integration of the cells. At the end she broke down saying, "We can't take any more rubbish in Temploni" and was unable to control her tears.

The only response she got from the Mayor was that everything would be done according to the amendments to the environmental regulations, adding that we needed to look at the reality - waste management needs land and space.





#### Official opening of Corfu Archaeological Museum with Deputy Minister of Culture



Official opening ceremony

CORFU. Deputy Minister of Culture Kostas Stratis cut the ribbon to officially open the renovated Archaeological Museum on Sunday afternoon accompanied by the Director of Corfu Antiquities Inspectorate Tenia Rigakou.

Also present at the opening were Regional Governor Theodoros Galiatsatos, Corfu Mayor Kostas Nikolouzos, Deputy Regional Governor Nikoletta Pandi, the two SYRIZA MPs Fotini Vaki and Kostas Pavlidis, local and regional councillors and many others.

The museum has been completely renovated with exhibits displayed in a completely new way and is now a true 'jewel'. The space has been divided into historical periods and there are now screens along with hardware. A museum shop will open shortly.

Corfu Archaeological Museum had been closed for renovation for five years before - after many difficulties - reopening at the beginning of November 2018.

The complete renovation was funded by the European Regional Development Fund and was completed in 2017 and a team from the Ministry of Culture came to the Museum to take over the work.

The reopening was delayed by the lack of personnel which affected all the archaeological and historical sites in Corfu (a reminder that the New Fortress remained closed last summer!). The closed Archaeological Museum was a matter of great concern for the local community and tourism professionals and the matter reached the Greek Parliament. The non-operation of this tourist attraction led to a loss of potential income. The official opening had also become a source of contention recently between the two major political parties - SYRIZA and ND - in this election period.

## Survivor

"I arrived at the gate two minutes after it was closed. I saw the other passengers getting on board and I was really upset they wouldn't let me in," Antonis Mavropoulos told private Alpha TV on Sunday evening. He was still in shock.

It was "pure luck" or a sequence of factors that Mavropoulos did not get on the fatal flight of Ethiopian Airlines that crashed six minutes after the take off killing 157 people, 149 passengers and 8 crew members.

Mavropoulos had arrived to Addis Abeba airport via another connection flight. He had his suitcase with him. "Because of the suitcase, they didn't have to wait for me," he said.

He explains that the reason he was late was that the person in charge to take him from the arrived plane to the departing one, flight ET 302, was late five minutes. "Then I went to the departure gate by myself," he added.

"Had I given my suitcase or had the person in charge be in time, I would have being on board of the plane," he stressed.

He described this experience is "one of the moments in life that changes the perspective of life ... You realize that our life is hanging from unbranded filaments that you understand when they break apart.."

As he was the only person that missed the crashed flight, Mavropoulos had to undergo a kind of "pseudo-interrogation" as he said. "They kept me as potential suspect but it was clear there was no logical connection between me and the crash."

Later on the day, Mavropoulos wrote down his shocking experience to have escaped death on his Facebook account.

March 10, 2019-my lucky day
Running to catch flight et 302 Addis Ababa – Nairobi,
which crashed 6 minutes after taking off, I had my nerves
because there was no one to help me go fast. I lost it for two
minutes, when I arrived, the boarding was closed and I
watched the last passengers in tunnel go in – I screamed to

put me in but they didn't allow it. In fact, the flight lost it because I didn't give a suitcase (otherwise they would expect me for 10-15 minutes or more, because finding a suitcase loaded wants at least 40 minutes). Also, as I learned later, I lost her because I came out first and very quickly from the plane and the connection ambassador who came to receive me didn't find me

Airport people, kind, promoted me to the next flight that would leave at 11:20, they apologized for the inconvenience and transferred me to a nice lounge for the waiting.

On 10:50, as we joined the next flight, two security officers informed me that for security reasons that a senior officer will explain to me, they will not allow my boarding. In my intense protests they left no margin of discussion and led me to their superior, to the airport police department.

He told me gently not to protest and say thank you to God, because I am the only passenger who did not enter the flight et 302 which is missing. And that this was why they can't let me go, until I determine who I am, because I didn't get on the flight and everything. At First I thought he was lying, but his style left no margin of doubt.

I felt the ground lost under my feet, but I came back in 1-2 seconds because I thought something else would happen, some communication problem maybe. People were kind, they asked that they had to ask, they my elements and let me wait.

They made me sit in a living room and they told me to wait there until they warn me.

I was looking on the internet to find elements for the flight, friends from Nairobi informed me that 30 minutes after the expected time had not landed and there was no information about her luck and suddenly all the wifi of the airport.

Fortunately there are sms – from close friend I learned that the flight crashed almost just took off and that the issue was going out in the Greek media.

Then I realized that I must immediately contact my own people and tell them that I was not in and that for two small random circumstances I lost the flight – the moment I made that thought i collapsed because then exactly I realized how lucky I stood.

I'm posting it because I want to tell everyone that the invisible and, nēmatídia of fortune, the out-of-plan circumstances knit the web in which our life is taken. It's millions of small threads we almost never feel – but one to break is enough to feed the whole web instantly.

Really, it's the first time I'm so glad I wrote a post and I'm grateful to live and that I have so many friends that made me feel their love – kisses to all and a warm thank you for your touching support. Special citation reference for early surgery and support to Jeroen Par Dijk Panos Fragiadakis Haris Kamariotakis and a big sorry to my family for the shock you've been looking for.

Maybe not too old to rock n roll – but certainly too young to die...
