Another year has almost gone by. A year to forget soon, regretfully.

We hope you were not affected too much, personally.

We also hope that, despite possible restrictions, you will have a very nice Christmas.

For many it will be an old-fashioned Christmas, with close relatives only.

And then we hope 2021 will be MUCH BETTER for everybody.

If the frequent announcements of new infections cause you many worries, then we would like to point out that, worldwide, total mortality (all causes) for 2020 turns out to be not much higher than in previous years. In many countries the number is even lower than in 2017 or 2018. This is remarkable, because treatment of other life-threatening illnesses was often delayed. One would expect increased mortality for that reason alone.

So, it looks like (so far) we are experiencing a shift in causes rather than an increase. Let us hope it will stay like that.

Flower of the Month January -Algerian Iris

DEEP MIDWINTER IN CORFU is hardly a time for wild flowers. The autumn blooms are gone, and even with good weather we have to wait until February for the first early-spring flowers

to appear. But in this dead time, one of Corfu's most spectacular blooms appears, the Algerian Iris (Iris unguicularis).

This Mediterranean perennial grows most happily in mountainous areas since it likes a dryish soil and full

sun. Vibrant purple in colour, the three drooping petals incorporate a beautiful spray of white and buttery yellow emanating from their base.

These markings once caused a bit of a storm in the field of botany. The late Gouvia resident, Marjorie Holmes - a world-renowned botanical illustrator - was painting an exacting study of one of these flowers, a Corfu-sourced bloom, when she observed that the gold and ivory pattern of its markings was slightly but substantially different from an Iris of other provenance. I suppose she must have checked other Irises in case this was an aberrance, but finally she established that the Algerian Iris of Corfu was probably a sub species of the general Mediterranean one. I believe that she submitted her findings to the Royal Horticultural Society, of which she was a member, but I have no idea if the flower was finally recognised, since Lady Holmes passed on before she could announce the result.

If our Iris has indeed been recognised, it should be known as Iris unguicularis ssp. corcyrensis. Or even Iris unguicularis ssp.

holmesensis, in honour of its discoverer.
